

Digital Health Passport (DHP) for Epilepsy

Project Information for Research Participants / Stage 1

Background

The Digital Health Passport, developed by Tiny Medical Apps, is a free self-management app for children and young people with asthma and allergies. New app modules are currently under development to support children and young people with other conditions such as epilepsy.

Purpose of this project

We want to speak to young people with epilepsy and their carers to understand how an app for epilepsy could help children and young people manage their condition and what features and content would be valuable.

What is involved

You will be invited to join an online workshop with 5-7 other participants and the research moderators to share your experience with managing epilepsy and discuss ideas for an epilepsy app.

- The workshop will take place in May (see dates below)
- The workshop will last 90 minutes
- You will need a quiet place, a computer or a laptop, internet connection, and working speakers, microphone and camera
- The workshop will be carried out using Microsoft Teams or similar technology
- The link to join the meeting will be shared with you beforehand
- You will be asked to sign a Consent Form that will explain how we use the information collected during the workshop
- The information and comments you share with us will be kept confidential and only used in anonymised form to inform, develop and promote the app
- As a token of gratitude you will receive a £35 voucher
